### Tuesday, March 16

Temp 50. Very windy S to SW. **Henny** went to special council meeting at **R. Brown's**. Radio said boat was coming Friday. Washed, ironed, mended and baked. [Roland Brown]

### Wednesday, March 17

Temp 30. Cloudy and damp. **Sonny** and **Herb** brought boats over. Washed my kitchen ceiling and cleaned dresser drawers. Talked to **Ila** and **Gerry** on phone (Rosella's daughters). [Sonny **Elfers** and Herb **Bickley**]

### Thursday, March 18

Temp 33. Beautiful clear day. **Henny** and **Orv** left with **Hinde** at 8 A.M. to get their boats. I'm washing and cleaning. [Orv is **Orville Lange**]

## A Tribute to Betsy—

If it was summer with more people on the island, I would have asked many of you for your thoughts of Betsy on her passing from this life. Because, if you knew Betsy, you were her friend, because she was everyone's friend. She was gracious and caring, and overlooked all of our shortcomings as human beings. I met Betsy Walcott through the KI Historical Association when I worked with the gift shop closely one year and I was told that she might help organize the volunteers. When I called her and asked her to once again volunteer her time, she said yes. She continued to be our coordinator for the gift shop volunteers even though she was locked in a struggle with cancer for several years. She was always cheerful, always asking about

others, and never put off by our personal foibles. Betsy is missed and will continue to be missed by the many who have crossed her path in life.

### Claudia Brown More memories of Betsy

It was a privilege to know Betsy. Although our paths seldom crossed, each time we met it was as though we had known each other for years. I felt comfortable in her presence and she gave me the sense that, no matter what the circumstances, "everything will be OK." She had a wonderful sense of humor, and it was a joy to be in her company, especially when we had "lunch with the girls." She did more than her share of the volunteering. Wherever there was a need, she was there, and always with a smile. If I was to be asked why I enjoy

living on Kelleys Island, I would say it is because of people like Betsy.

Betsy was a special, classy lady. Although I went to high school with her, she was an upperclassman, and we didn't know each other. As a lowly freshman, and new to the school, I was in awe of her. Betsy was a special, classy lady.

Later, when we met on Kelleys Island, I found that she was still one cool lady. She was honest and unpretentious, kind, thoughtful, and generous—qualities that are hard to find in people today.

about anything, and she always had something interesting or funny to say, or a perspective that I hadn't thought of.

She will be missed not only by you and your families, but also by those of us who were her friends. She really added something rare and special to our island women's group, and it's hard to know that she won't be joining us in our summer silliness.

Our Red Hat Society president, Jane Wick, sent all of us members a card near Valentine's day, that contained this message: "God gave us memories so we could have roses in winter and mothers forever." This seems an especially true sentiment for all of us right now.

I do want to add that at her memorial service, one of her friends said that she and Betsy had been having a glass of wine

in the garden, and a cardinal flew by. Betsy said, "In my next life, I want to come back as a cardinal." The friend said that when next we see a cardinal, just think of it as Betsy dropping by to say hi! I thought that was a lovely story.

The next morning, at home, when I went to let the dogs out, there was the biggest, brightest, fattest, red cardinal you ever saw, and we haven't had many cardinals around this winter in our hemlock tree--I just looked up and said, "Hi, Betsy!" It's nice to have such a happy remembrance of Betsy.

She was one very special lady, and she fought her cancer with such dignity. Once last summer when I told her I admired her courage in the face of all she was battling, she downplayed her bravery, and said, "You do what ya' gotta do." She didn't dramatize it or anything else, she just said it like it was, and that's what was special about Betsy.

## Rosella's Diary, cont.

### Friday, March 19

Temp 50. Went to town. Very rough - S wind. Hurricane in afternoon at 1:30. Demolished **Sonny's** airplane and **Bob** was in school that was hit. Stayed with **Madeline** all night. Much damage to Island. Trees and chimneys were toppled. Our dock was tilted. First trip of boat. [Sonny Elfers]

### Saturday, March 20

Temp 60. Came home at 9:00 a.m. **Mary** and I and kids took ride and viewed damage. **Ila** and **Gerry** came on the boat. **Henny** set the first nets - 5. **Rita** came home with baby. [Rita **Betzenheimer** and the baby is **Teri Betzenheimer**]

### Sunday, March 21

Set 5 more nets. Rain storm with lightning and thunder in evening. Very foggy most of day. Gerry left with **Hershberger** at 3:40 p.m. [Hershberger was a plane pilot & flew to Kelleys Island]

### Monday, March 22

Temp 52 degrees. Washed. Wayne came at 9 a.m.. Ila left on 8 o'clock boat.

### Tuesday, March 23

Temp 40. Northeast. First lift today - 13 boxes. [fishing with nets]

### Wednesday, March 24

Fair. Set four nets out line. Helped **Mary M.** get side altar ready for Holy Thursday. Wayne and I raked the whole yard. [Mary **Marchky**]

### Thursday, March 25

Weather NE. and cold. Went to 7:30 Mass on Holy Thursday. Church cold and door was open when we got home - nearly froze. Had 16 boxes fish. Went to services at 7 PM. Had choir practice after. Hear **Howie Brown** has Post Office. [Howard Brown will be next Postmaster]

### Friday, March 26

Windy and warm. Services a 7:30 AM. No afternoon Service but again at 7 PM. Helped Mary **Marchky** fix altar. Gerry came home with Hershberger for \$1.15 and missed the 3 o'clock boat. Wayne left at 2 o'clock for Sandusky - forgot fish - Sonny took them over. Had 14 boxes of fish out of 4 nets out at the line. Blew fresh from the south in the afternoon.

### Saturday, March 27

Went to Church at 7 AM. Kids came on 4 o'clock boat. **Wayne, Marion, Ila** and **Jim**. [James Himmelein, daughter Ila's future husband]

### Sunday, March 28

Went to 9 o'clock Easter Mass. Nice day about freezing around 25 degrees. Nice sunny afternoon.

### Monday, March 29

Went to pot luck supper at Marquette. Had a good supper and time. 23 boxes fish around Island. [Marquette was Marquette School at the corner of Woodford Rd. and Addison St., the Catholic School and Social Hall aka Marquette Hall after the school closed]

### Tuesday, March 30

34 boxes fish out of 6 nets at line. Very windy. Temperature 26. Ila left on 2 o'clock boat.

### Wednesday, March 31

Barometer way down. Spring storm - rain and wind southeast to south strong. 5 boxes out of 7 nets around island. Cleaned attic.

### Thursday, April 1

Temperature 46. Sunny - cool - damp. 2 boxes fish out of 13 nets. Nice day on lake. Henny gone to Council meeting.

### Friday, April 2

Clear day. Went to town - had dinner with Ila. 20 boxes fish.

### Saturday, April 3

Fair weather. Gerry came on Challenger. Masquerade at school. 23 boxes of fish out of 17 nets.

### Sunday, April 4

Gerry left at 5 PM. Henny went to Church Council meeting.

### Monday, April 5

Temp. 58. Fair - moderate south winds. Washed and cleaned closets. 42 boxes fish.

### Tuesday, April 6

Cold and damp. Washed all the woodwork upstairs. Had 34 boxes fish.

### Wednesday, April 7

A little warmer but threatening all day. Aired all bedding and finished cleaning upstairs. 32 boxes.

### Thursday, April 8

Beautiful sunny, windy day. By night wind reached gale force. West to northwest. Water not down. 22 boxes. Boat didn't come back last night. Cleaned stairway.

### Friday, April 9

Blowing very hard. West. Men didn't work today. **Henny** at meeting with **Beltz** at D.S. (*I can't make this out*) for C of C. Henny raked yard across the street. [C of C- Chamber of Commerce]

### Saturday, April 10

Temp in the 60s. 50 boxes fish out of 17 nets. 25 boxes pickerel out the line. Chamber Commerce meeting in Town Hall. Successful. **Ila** came on 4 PM boat. **Sandra** came in AM on boat. **Sonny** bought a new airplane.

### Sunday, April 11

Miserable day - wind (south) and rain. Wind died out in afternoon. **Ila** and **Sandra** went back on Commuter.

### Monday, April 12

Fair. Temp 42 degrees. Light breeze northwest. Washed and started to clean living room. 42 boxes - half good.

### Tuesday, April 13

Northeast gale. Two freighters anchored off south shore. Gold fish by the thousands at the Kelley pond culvert. Finished cleaning living room. Miserable day - rain. Letter from **Wayne**.

### Wednesday, April 14

Moderate northeast winds. **Carl Moller** (?) and **Jim Seeholzer** digging a ditch to culvert to leave the fish out. Fish boats out. 10 boxes. Cleaned cupboards. Went to board meeting - Had quite a session until 11 PM. (Kids not learning.)

### Thursday, April 15

Temperature 38. Light NW wind. 32 boxes good fish - out the line. Finished cleaning kitchen. My hands!!

### Friday, April 16

Temperature 50. Cleaning dining room. I am through inside. Henny's birthday. Strong south winds. (*New entry:*) "S" shifting to NW. Cold again. 10 boxes. Henny gone to C of C

meeting and Council meeting. I took **Mary** and kids to show Enjoying a quiet evening alone. [**Mary Betzenheimer**]

### Saturday, April 17

Temp 34 degrees. **Ila**, **Wayne**, **Marion** and **Gerry** come on 4 PM boat.

### Sunday, April 18

Temperature 36 degrees. Clear day. All went out to lift a net to get fish for kids to take back. Going to Beltz tonight. (*New entry:*) Got home at 11:30 PM. Discussed building house.

### Monday, April 19

Washed, ironed and washed windows. 35 boxes good fish. Temp 60 degrees. Partly cloudy until afternoon.

### Tuesday, April 20

Temp 80 degrees. (*Really!*) At night 40 degrees. NW strong winds. Washed three porches and cellar way. Sure was tired! 15 boxes.

### Wednesday, April 21

Temp 38 degrees. Cold and clear. Washed down bathroom and ironed bedroom curtains. Baked lemon pie and sponge cake. Went down to the lot after supper - Henny worked on lot all day. NW to NE winds - no one on lake. Burned the brush pile - at last!

### Thursday, April 22

(*No entry.*)

### Friday, April 23

Went to town. Good day. Stayed until 8 PM. Came home with **Cath** (?) **B. and Helen B.** 11 boxes.

### Saturday, April 24

20 boxes. **Ila**, **Gerry**, **Wayne** & **Marion** came with Browns. "M.E" wasn't ready. Get it next Friday. Didn't feel good. Too much arguing and commotion. [M.E. is boat named after daughter **Mary Ellen**]

### Sunday, April 25

Beautiful day. Took **Ruth Dorsey** and Mother for a ride. **Carrol** (?) over electioneering. Kids went back on Challenger. Spent early evening at **Vi's**. Henny & **Jack** at Beltz'. [**Vi Haig**]

## Rosella's Diary, Cont.

### Monday, April 26

Beautiful wash day. Temp. 60 degrees. S. E. breeze. Planted the garden.

### Tuesday, April 27

Several thunder showers - one severe - struck two trees - one in Ward's yard and one on **Ollie S.** bank - ripped bark off trunk to ground. Cleaned screens and car. Went to **Baumans** in evening. 11 boxes. [Ollie **Schlesselman**]

### Wednesday, April 28

Cool clear day. Mr. **John Bauman's** funeral today at 10:30 AM. **Fr. Dick, Fr. Joe and Fr. Pfeiffer** - went well. 7 boxes today - N.E. sea. Visited **Mrs. Schoewe** and **Mrs. Suhr**. **Vi** came for lunch.

### Thursday, April 29

Temp. 44. Beautiful clear day. **Henny** and **Beltz** to town to buy lumber for house. 20 boxes. Forgot specification plans but can get supplies.

### Friday, April 30

Still cool - furnace fire. 40 degrees. 9 boxes. Pulled 3 nets. Looked for **Wayne** and cruiser. Called later said he'd come in morning. **Ila** went to Oxford.

### Saturday, May 1

Temp 46. Beautiful cool clear day. **Wayne, Gerry** and **Marion** came from Lakeside with cruiser.

### Sunday, May 2

Rain and NE. Miserable. **Art** up for dinner and lunch. Kids left with **Browns** at 5 PM. **M. E.** and **Ronnie** had rough ride from P-in-B. [**Brown's Water Taxi** from Lakeside]

### Monday, May 3

Temp 50. Fair day. Washed and ironed. **Henny** couldn't go on lake so burned brush and cleaned the lot.

### Tuesday, May 4

Temp 46 and cloudy. Election Day. Rained hard at night. **M. E.** and I went down to **Beltz'** to have a letter typed for **Henny** **Henny** hauled stone for steps. 32 boxes fish. (Separate entry: 1949: Temp 85 degrees.) Went to town. Bought rugs, lamp, hassock and maple kitchen set.

### Wednesday, May 5

Temp 5. Clear day. **Chick** won over **Fritz** 43 to 32. **Mary** went to town and took my fur coat to **Frankel's**. Slip in stationary box. Spent the evening on the boat. Beautiful day - I washed bedding

and mowed across the street. [Frank "Chick" Hamilton, Fritz Martin]

### Thursday, May 6

Cool - cloudy - rain at night. Temp 54. Went to Lakeside in the "M.E." Got paint and varnish. Had a hard time getting motor started. Took **V. Beltz**, kids and **Mary** out riding in the afternoon. **Henny** went to Council meeting.

### Friday, May 7

Miserable rainy day. Strong W winds. 5 boxes. 4 nets out the line. Kids went to the show. We tied out the cruiser.

### Saturday, May 8

Cold. 35 degrees. Cleared at 9 AM. Still windy - can't go on the lake. My sewing machine came broken. Statement arrived today. Best spring ever.

### Sunday, May 9

(No entry.)

### Monday, May 10

Cool and raining. Went to town. Had dinner at **Hanson's** with **Ila**, **Marion** and **Gerry**. Took big radio over.

### Tuesday, May 11

Washed, ironed at night. Worked on Cruiser in afternoon. Fair day Rained hard at night. **Henny** went to C. C. meeting at Port Clinton - **Navorska** and **P. Beltz** went along.

### Wednesday, May 12

N. E. wind - cool. Worked on Cruiser. **Henny** came at noon. Rained last night.

### Thursday, May 13

N.E. wind - cool. Worked on Cruiser. Cleaned upstairs in AM.

### Friday, May 14

Finished varnishing Cruiser - rained on it one side. Must be done over. **Henny** went to Lakeside to get **Mama** - boys didn't come.

### Saturday, May 15

Fair in AM. **Jim**, **Wayne** and **Ila** came on Challenger. Went over at 12 PM to get **Gerry** and **Marion**. Had noodle soup and short cake for supper. Rained during night.

### Sunday, May 16

Beautiful warm and balmy day. Took **Jim** back at 2 PM. At 7 PM NW rain and thunder storm came up - **Henny** in worst of it coming from Lakeside. Brought **M. E.**, **Ron**, **Willard** and **Carol** home - took kids over. **Mrs. Clemons** met them. Went to dinner at 6 PM at **Helen's**. Lights out all night. [Willard **Norris**, **Carol Haig**]

### Monday, May 17

N.W. wind, raining and cold - washed. Lights came on at 10:30 AM. Got ironing and everything done. Turned out sunny but windy.

### Tuesday, May 18

Temp 54 degrees. Sunny and north wind. Took varnish off boat for 2nd time. Went down to **Beltz** in evening. 13 boxes fish.

### Wednesday, May 19

Clear & cool - helped clean house at Mom's. [Mom was **Rose Lange**]

### Thursday, May 20

Clear day. Temp up to 68. Varnished the boat and it looks good this time. 12 boxes fish. **Henny** dug for stone steps on bank. **Paul Brown** hit telephone pole at **Becker's**. Damaged car. Listened to **Cleveland & Boston** - night game. Clev - 13, Boston - 4.

### Friday, May 21

Clear and cool. Played High Mass for **Mr. Seeholzer** and repaired pedals on organ. [Mr. **Charles Seeholzer**]

### Saturday, May 22

Fair & cool. **Ila** & **Gerry** came at 2 PM. Went to **Auxiliary** Bakery sale. [**Madonna Auxiliary**]

### Sunday, May 23

Rained hard at noon. Girls went back on 5 PM boat. Went to **Godfrey's** and **Beltz** - making plans for starting the house. [**Godfrey Schock**]

### Monday, May 24

Cool and clear. Washed down front compartment of cruiser. What a job! Almost got seasick. **Art** and **Paul** laid out basement on new house. [Art **Beatty** and **Paul Beltz**]

### Wednesday, May 26

Went to town. First calm warm clear day of the spring. **Marion** drove me around to order material for house.

### Thursday, May 27

Clear, warm. Light NE wind.

### Friday, May 28

Clear day. Got the kids at Lakeside.

### Saturday, May 29

Blowing from NE. **Cleveland** boats held back by weather. 8 made the trip - got here at 8:00 PM. Yacht Club had a dance - great success.

### Sunday (Memorial Day), May 30

Still blowing. Services at hall and cemetery. Yachts went to Pt Clinton. **Wayne**, **Marion**, **Jim** and **Ila** got back at 10 PM.

### Monday, May 31

Still a NE breeze. Fishermen didn't work. Took kids back to Lakeside at 7:30 PM. **Wayne** forgot billfold, **Don** his books, **Gerry** the fish. Gerry fell down steps at bank - tore shoes - x!!\*!, if you know what I mean! [Don **Haig**]

### Tuesday, June 1

Beautiful day. Had forty boxes fish - good for this time of year. Television for the first time at **Martin's** and **Tackie's**. [Martin's Bar now the Village Pump, Tackie ran the **Casino**]

### Wednesday, June 2

Weather warm and clear. Painted cockpit floor blue - All remover wasn't off so **Vi** & **I** went down at 8 PM and took it off. Some job. (This was on Fri, June 4.)

### Thursday, June 3

Temp hot. Henny went to council meeting.

### Friday, June 4

Cleaned cellar and repaired (replaced) screens in comb. doors. Very hot.

### Saturday, June 5

Ila and Gerry came in PM. NE wind - fair day. Henny went to Chamber of

Commerce meeting - spent evening with **Kate**. Commencement (should have gone). [Kate **Betzenheimer**]

## Rosella's Diary background:

Rosella's Diary (1948) was given to **Ila (Beatty) (Himmelein) Dick's** daughter **Jeri (Himmelein) (Dick) Yoest** by her Grandmother **Rosella (Elfers) Beatty**.

Rosella was born June 15, 1903 and passed from this life in May, 1985. She was raised on Kelleys Island, the daughter of **Rose Moross** and **Walter Elfers**. Rosella took piano lessons as a young girl, about age 12, traveling by ferry by herself with her music. After twelve lessons she decided she had an ear for music and stopped her lessons. Rosella played piano for silent movies at the Casino and dances and masquerades at the Town Hall.

She also played the organ at St. Michael's Church for forty years. She

served on the Kelleys Island School Board and she was the first woman to be elected to Kelleys Island Village Council.

Rosella married **Henry "Henny" T. Beatty**. Their children were **Wayne, Ila, Gerry, Ronny, and Mary Ellen**. In addition, they had three children who died in infancy.

Through reading Rosella's daily entries, you can get a pretty good sense of what life was like on Kelleys Island for a wife and mother in 1948. We are reprinting the entries here through the generosity of **Jeri Yoest**. Biographical information was written with the consultation of Rosella's daughters **Ila Dick** and **Gerry Bickley**. Rosella's home was the 2nd home behind the West home on Huntington Lane. In 1948 there were 500-600 year-'round residents on Kelleys. Explanatory notes were added.
